## **GOOD NEWS FOR CASSOWARIES AT MISSION BEACH**

On Friday 15th July 2011the second Lot 66 development application, referred for assessment under the EPBC Act, was withdrawn

This good news, and heaven knows they need some after the number of reported cassowary road deaths since Cyclone Yasi, is that a vital block, known as Lot 66- Garrett's corridor - a cassowary corridor linking coastal reserve and World Heritage upland habitat, has been withdrawn from development application and can hopefully be private purchased by and government interests to preserve it from future development attempts. This success is due in no small part to the amazing persistence of

Mission Beach locals and their lobbying of government departments. So well done Liz and team. And thanks to the Kuranda locals who added their voices to the call to preserve this block.. The survival of many threatened species depends upon sufficient sustain habitat to viable Preserving populations. and increasing rainforest habitat for our local threatened species is one of the main priorities of Kuranda Envirocare
