Well, what great planting weather, with this rain and the sunshine bound to follow, spring growth will be accelerating. You may have noticed this rain knocking white flowers from blooming trees onto the roadside near the bottom of the Kuranda range and on the left hand side of the Venom Zoo entrance last Thursday morning. Chances are they're from the rainforest giant - Alstonia scholaris - or Milkwood pine. We share this huge native tree, growing to 40m, with Southeast Asian countries, China and India.

TREE OF THE MONTH

This species has excellent potential and is slowly gaining a place in horticulture.

Selected forms produce masses of cream to yellow or brownish flowers which attract birds, followed by bright pink or red fruits in profusion.

This species has no commercial value and does not grow large enough to produce useful logs. The fruits are edible however and have been used to make iam and tarts.

In Kuranda these street trees are fruiting at the moment on the Post Office corner and opposite the Post Office. We have seedlings available in the nursery plus other bush tucker trees such as Davidson plum, Burdekin plum and the 1m high shrub Cedar Bay cherry (the latter very suitable for a small sunny or semi shady space in your garden).
