JAPANESE STUDENTS -FIRST TIME EVER -TREE PLANTING

In late March, 19 Japanese students aged between 11 and 16, from a language school, arrived to plant 100 trees in our Myola 4 site behind the nursery. The little kids managed the unfamiliar tasks in no time at all. We chose smaller growing edge species for planting next to the railway line, and the others were mixed rainforest species to attract Cassowaries and other native birds, butterflies and other fauna. They enjoyed an Aussie morning tea of damper and scones, which was a little different from their usual fare, we presented the students with certificates and they learnt a little more about the great things EnviroCare volunteers do.
