The students learned different ways to prepare seed ready for propagation, how to pot up seedlings, hygiene and maintenance of a nursery and the ins and outs of revegetating natural areas with native plant species. The group will be welcomed back in February for a tree planting activity.



Frog Monitoring Program croak off

Dr Conrad Hoskins, (aka the frog whisperer), shared a very informative and interesting couple of evenings with 25 of us. He started with a slide show explaining our local frog species and how to identify them via their calls. We then went in convoy to Warril Ck where we turned off our torches and listened intently for frog communications. As the wet season has not yet started they were not as active as we hoped but we did get to hear their distinct calls It was great to see the Myola Frog and the Stoney Ck frog hiding in the Lomandra grass and sitting on the River cherry branches. There are 6 monitoring sites in the Kuranda area where volunteers will go once a month to record the various frog calls so we can see if the numbers of the critically endangered Kuranda Tree frog are increasing or declining.
