A Norwegian photography class recently visited Kuranda for 10 days and, as part of the cultural exchange, joined us for two days to see what Envirocare does. They joined our community tree-planting event which was a fantastic effort, with nearly 50 volunteers who planted the 600 trees in less than an hour, and had fun snapping several massive fig trees near Owens Creek. The class also took part in our Rainforest Bird Monitoring Program at a revegetation site in Myola.



ELECTRIC JAPANESE PLANTERS DIG



A group of 40 Japanese 18 to 25 yr olds, from a large electricity company, decided they wanted to dig, plant and water-in 400 trees, also providing financial support for the seedlings' maintenance through to canopy cover. The group of four ten-person teams came from the four main Japanese islands and were very well organised, working hard with that island competitiveness showing through. PLANT OF THE MONTH

– *Podocarpus grayae* (northern brown pine)



These ancient trees bear fruit from Dec – Feb which is eaten by Cassowaries and Pigeons. The new leaves are lime green and their drooping pencil shaped leaves and

straight trunk makes them an extremely attractive addition to your property. They cost a \$2 donation. Our rare hibiscus shrubs have been drastically reduced in price due to outgrowing their pots. Both Hibiscus species have beautiful flowers: yellow or purple.
