Community Tree Planting - Cain Creek



For our last December community planting day of 2013 we gathered 50 volunteers together and planted 800 trees along the Barron River at Cain Creek. This planting is part of the Biodiversity Fund that enables us to connect wildlife corridors from Fairyland to Mantaka over a 5 year period. By doing this we are minimising erosion, filtering sediments from draining to the Reef and making homes for rare and threatened plant and animal species! You can see this planting from Myola Road, just after you pass the end of Monaro Close, going towards Kuranda.

PLANT OF THE MONTH - Melicope elleryana



These beautiful butterfly and bird-attracting rainforest trees flower from Dec – Apr and grow up to 35m tall. It is the host plant for the vivid blue Ulysses butterfly that abounds in the Cairns and Kuranda region. We also have its little sister, the M.rubra species, at 3-4m max height. A must for your garden beds. If you'd like to come in and check out our great selection of native plants, don't hesitate to drop in for a chat. See below for opening hours. Frog Friendly Face of Jum Rum Creek

We were successful in a grant application to the Federal Government's Caring For our Country Fund. This project allows us to raise awareness of the importance of water quality for creek life and to increase community involvement in supporting the long term conservation of the Kuranda Tree Frog, which is endemic to the Kuranda area and is also critically endangered. Recently our "site owners" group has been Myola frog monitoring, once a month in the 3rd week of each month, for the last part of 2013. We welcome anyone who wants to come along to learn about the frog calls and be a part of the program even if only for a night. You could even take on a site if you're really keen.
