Frogs face a dicey future

This small article was printed in the Australian newspaper and seems very pertinent as the Myola frog researcher is in town at present. It has been paraphrased below.

ARMAGEDDON is approaching for frogs throughout the world, warns internationally renowned primatologist Jane Goodall.

Jane Goodall, the 74-year-old renowned primatologist and conservationist has been visiting Australia to discuss the potential mass extinction of frogs and how an international breeding program, dubbed the Amphibian Ark, might be the only hope for hundreds of species.

Frogs are "the canary in the coalmine", Dr Goodall told The Australian yesterday.

"When you see frogs disappear at this rate, then you realise there's something very wrong with the ecosystem where they live. It's armageddon for frogs "

Of about 6000 amphibian species worldwide, it is estimated close to 2000 are now threatened with extinction.

She said frogs were particularly vulnerable to shrinking water supplies caused by climate change and poor agricultural practices, as well as pollution run-off. There is also a disease spreading throughout the world affecting frog populations

The Amphibian Ark project is being established as an insurance policy against mass extinction in several countries.

You'll start seeing a team of young people around the Myola area and Kuranda area in khaki work gear, maybe in a "troopee" with Conservation Volunteers marking. Give them a friendly wave as they're our local Greencorp team. On 6th October these young people, mostly from Kuranda, commenced an exciting six-month experience with Green Corps. During this time they'll be working on practical projects including:

- The development of a recreation area with a bush tucker "orchard" in conjunction and consultation with the local aboriginal community of Kowrowa.
- Mapping and eradication control on infestation of declared weeds across the Tableland shire
- Baseline water quality monitoring for the mouth of Warril creek which is a site of several endangered frog species including the Myola frog and the rare Myola palm species.
- Extending the current BRICMA Green Corridor Myola plantings to meet up with the Fairyland corridor, including the riparian section adjoining the Kuranda State School.
- Cleanup the walking trail along the riverside of the Barron and assist with picnic area construction and interpretive signage.
- Develop a brochure of indigenous bush tucker species, major bird attracting species (especially cassowary food plants) suitable for the local area.

On successful completion of their training they receive Certificates in Conservation and Land Management, First Aid, OH&S and Personal Development.
