Syzygium alliiligneum Onionwood MYRTACEAE



Typical height:

(>30m)

Spread:

Climate: Tropical

Light conditions: Part shade, full sun.

Growth habit: A large rainforest tree in the wild. In cultivation it is considerably smaller. Pink new growth.

Growing conditions: Endemic to North East Queensland, found growing within an altitudinal range of 0-700m, being more frequent in very wet lowland rainforest.

Flowers: Fragrant, Feb – Apr. **Fruit:** May – Oct.

Other: An attractive plant with large flowers and fruit. The fallen fruit is a food source for Cassowaries, and both the flowers and fruit attract a variety of birds, mammals, and insects. When grown in full sun it is shorter and bushy making it a good screening plant.
